Cheyenne Heritage Quilters September Minutes

President: Deb O'Grady called the meeting to order at 7:00PM.

Visitors: The guild welcomed Victoria Steel who has been quilting for a while, but only in Cheyenne for two years.

Announcements: Deb reminded the guild on behalf of Mary Ellen Little that dues are due, \$20 for the year and the new directory will be out in November.

Deb announced that 10 new wooden quilt stands are being made for quilt show.

Quilt Show: Frances Tormey asked the membership to donate $4 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " X 5" rectangles cut from batik fabrics (blue, green, purple and aqua) for the Opportunity Quilt. She prefers the fabrics be tone on tone and not multiple colors on one fabric.

Challenge Ornaments: Rose Slatten announced that the guild will be making Challenge Ornaments this year. They are due by Nov. 2. She asked that everyone make 2, one will be going to our sister guild in Maine. She would like to display the ornaments at the Quilt Show.

Social Committee: Jo-Ellen Maas announced that she, Lu Hart, Helen Jarvis and Betty Kempter are the Social Committee this year, but they would like to add one person that lives in town to the committee in case there are nights when the weather is bad and they can't make it. Donna Dolan volunteered.

In House Project: Jo-Ellen announced that Maggie Chittur will be heading up a Table Runner project similar to the Panel Challenge from last year. The table runners will be due in April.

Quilt Display at the Library: Wendy Ray announced that the quilts have been taken down from the library display windows and need to be picked up. Donna Groesbeck volunteered to take Daenette's quilts. Wendy said there were a lot of positive comments on the quilts at the library.

Program: Rose Slatten introduced Edie from Cheyenne who calls herself a quilt whisperer. She collects quilts mainly rescuing them from flea markets, garage sales, and auctions. Edie said you can learn a lot about history from quilts. She has worked on genealogy with these quilts. There are some friendship blocks that are signed on one quilt. She has some flour sack quilts, some are hand sewn, some are just the tops and need to be finished. Edie has two crazy quilts, one of which has newspaper in the seams dating to 1920s.

Show and Tell: Donna Dolan, Bonnie Chapman, Mari Harpold, Ione Petesen, Linda Herget, Anna Eggleston and Linda Price all shared items that they had made.

Announcements: Deb announced that Marci Baker will be taping a segment of The Quilt Show with Alex Anderson. Keep your eye out for Marci in the Oct. 10 episode. The National Quilt Museum is looking for quilts. The campaign is called Quilting for Quilts. They are looking for

full size or miniature quilts for fundraising purposes. They will be auctioning the quilts next year.

Treasurer's Report: Mary Ellen stated that she has copies if anyone is interested. Don't forget to renew your membership. She hopes to have the directory out by the first meeting in November.

Librarian: Cathy James encouraged members to take a look at what's in the library and please don't confuse library books with the books that Sue brought.

Quilt Show: Francis Tormey reminded members to bring in 2 ½" X 5" rectangles of purple, blue, green and aqua batiks for the Opportunity Quilt. Round Tuit – Carole Gardner announced that she has the cards for folks to list their Round Tuit projects, so please list each project on one card.

Quilts of Valor Sew Day – Linda Herget announced that the next QOV Sew Day is Thursday, Oct. 15 at the Quilted Corner. They will be doing some hand work in addition to other projects. So bring your supplies and join them. They will be having a QOV presentation of quilts at Our Savior Lutheran Church on Sunday, Nov. 8 for those who would like to participate or just see what a presentation looks like.

Community Quilts: Debbie Przymus talked about the Community Quilt sew in on Nov. 16. We will start at 6pm that night, bring your sewing supplies and a snack to share.

Program: Tracy Wilson gave a demonstration on the Triangle Frenzy Swirl pattern. It is a very easy and quick table runner to make using material that has wide border stipes. You can use an 8", 10" or 12" triangles depending on how large you want your table runner. Tracy uses 80/20 batting for her table runners. Quilting can be very simple like outlining the design and binding can be done in the usual methods or by using the envelope method.

Show and Tell: Wendy Ray, Mari Harpold, Linda Herget, and Linda Price all shared items that they had made.

Door Prizes: Arlene Flood, Christine Carozza and Bonnie Chapman Anna Eggleston all won prizes.

The meeting was adjourned.





Show & Tell Guidelines


Show one or more finished projects. Share information regarding each piece. Feel free to ask for critique or input. Show & Tell items will be displayed for everyone to view and enjoy during break
