



She demonstrated what causes a rounded corner on bindings, a pointy corner and a just beautiful corner and how to achieve those results. Marci has a video on You-tube that explains all this with pictures! She showed some wonderful quilts from her books, "Not your Grandmothers Flower Garden", " Not your Grandmothers Stars", and her newest revised book "Not Your Grandmother's Log Cabin", which the Monday class was based on.
