Please be thinking about books you might like to have added to the CHQG Library and provide your suggestions.

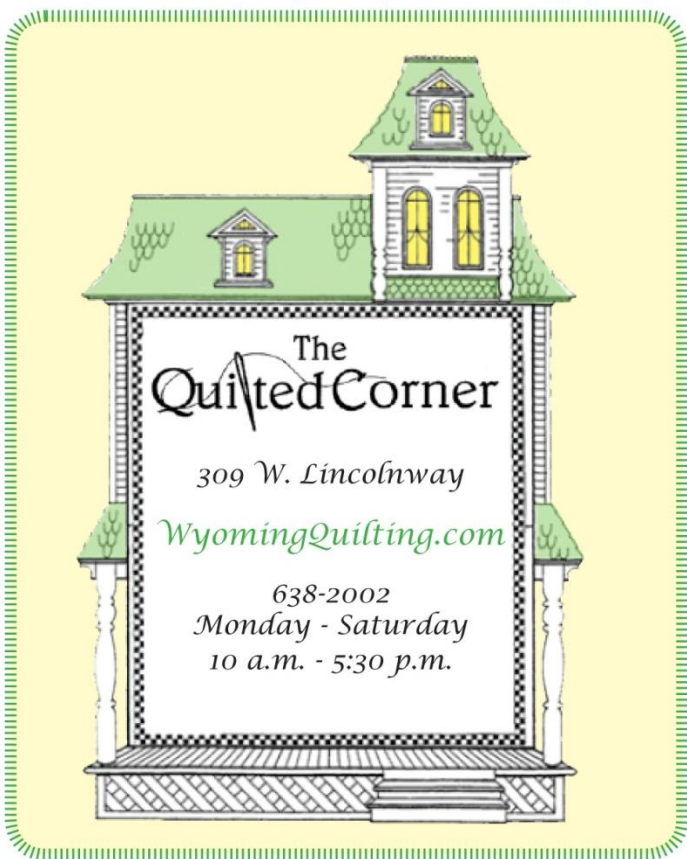
## **SEW DAY AT THE LIBRARY:** Jeannie Wilson
