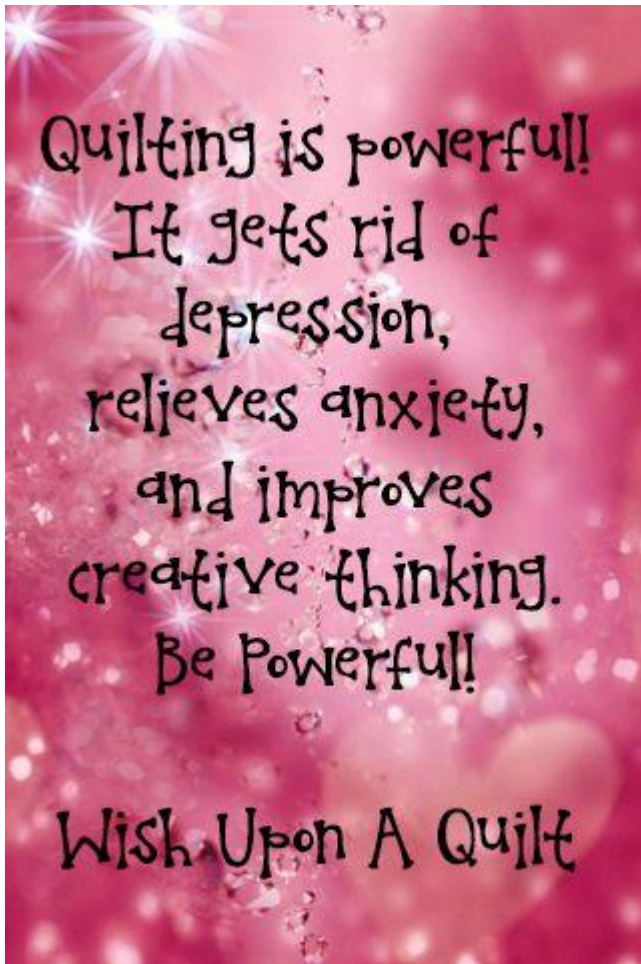

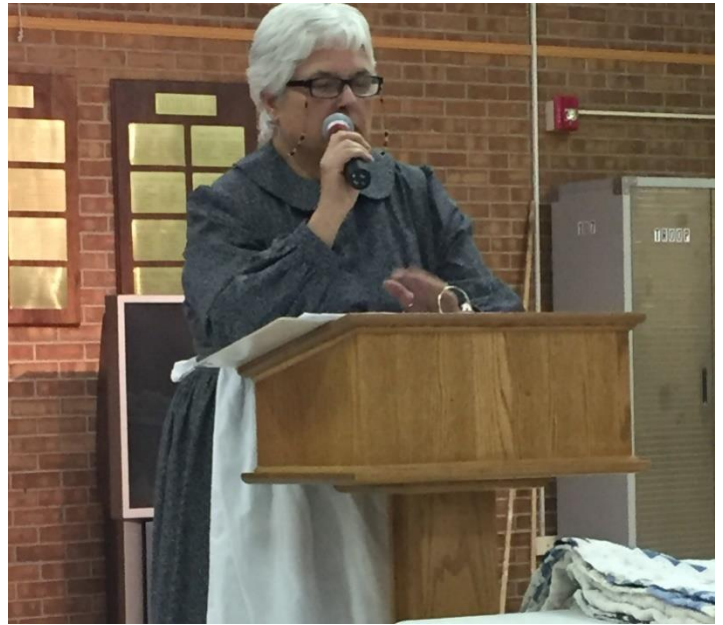

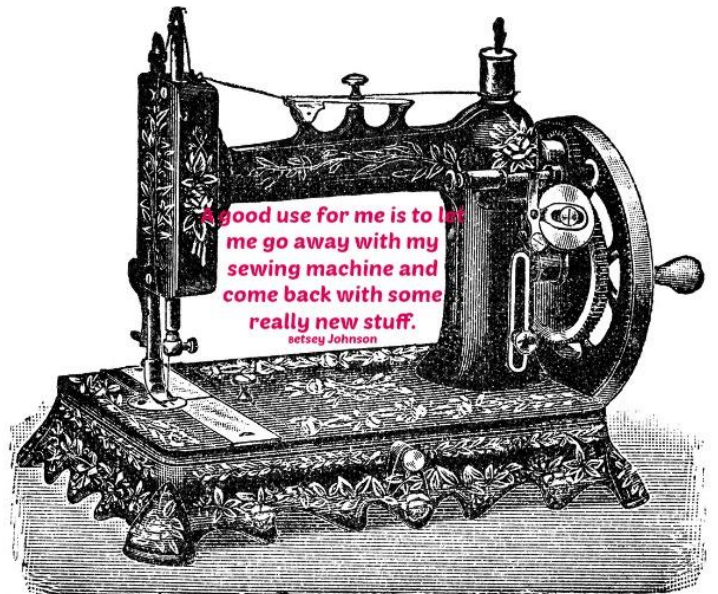

President Deb O'Grady called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Announcements

Slate of Officers – Deb announced the slate of nominations of officers for 2017. They are: President-Rose Slatten, President Elect-Mary Ellen Little, and Secretary Mary Jo Hamilton. We are still in need of nominees for Treasurer, Librarian, and Quilt Show Chair. Linda Price has agreed to head a committee for the Opportunity Quilt and Debbie Przymus has agreed to do Community Quilts again next year. Nominations were asked for from the floor to which there were none.

Library books – Deb announced that the board decided that the checkout period for library books will remain three months. Also, if a member loses a book they must pay half the cost of the book. Copying for the club.

Deb announced that the copying account at the UPS Store will not be refilled. Someone has been making a tremendous amount of copies on the account which is not monitored by UPS Store staff. If you make copies for the club, please submit your receipt to the Treasurer.

Community Quilt – Debbie Przymus presented 25 quilts to Blankets for Laramie County Kids as well as pillow cases. Janet Osborn also received 4 quilts to give to a family in the area. Debbie thanked everyone for their support of community quilts and encouraged us to take more kits. Finished kits can be turned into Blakeman's Sew & Vac, if that is more convenient.

Regional Retreat – Daenette More reminded the members about the WSQG regional retreat that will be held Oct. 21-23 at LCCC. Blakeman's will be there on Friday from 10:00-5:00 for free scissor sharpening. Daentte will teach a class on Saturday which has 5 openings. Sunday at 1:00 will be the first meeting for the Quilt Wyoming 19 committee.

Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum program

Brenda Braiden took on the persona of Maria Jane Forsyth, a pioneer born in Ohio and moved to Kansas and Nebraska with her family in 1800s. Maria talked about the hardship of plains living during that time like living in a sod house. She owned a treadle machine and sewed outside because there wasn't room inside. Maria also talked about the Homestead Act of 1862 and how 50% of the homesteads failed. Maria turned the program back to her friend Brenda who talked about quilts during the late 1800s and the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum.

One quilt was shared by Linda Herget, a project she made with her granddaughter.

Saturday Featured Class: 9:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m. Daenette More will be teaching a class called *Disappearing Dresdens*, which highlights a special prairie points ruler for exact points on a double pointed Dresden constructed onto a foundation for the perfect circles. Prairie Points template and pattern is available at the Quilted Corner, and at the Sat. class. This class is free to the first 20 that sign up but a pattern and the Prairie Points template is required. The supply list will be sent to you.

Supplemental Activities: Show and Tell of finished projects. Right-Left-Center game played on Sat. night. Bring 2 ½" strips WOF equal to 40" or better (6 strips in fall colors would be great!) Discount coupons for thread, fabric and other related merchandise from the quilt stores in our area and impromptu demonstrations

Our meals will be carry-in pot luck again. With you bringing your own drinks. (no alcoholic beverages on campus) We have ice and water available. Breakfast is on your own each day, as is lunch on Friday (encourages you to shop!)
