#### 2017 QUILT SHOW

It is time to start thinking about the quilt show. It is our time to show off our quilting projects. It also helps us pay for all the great programs we have throughout the year. For the quilt show to be a success, everybody needs to contribute their time and efforts. Here are some details about our show.

- \*Dates: Aug 17th 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. Aug. 18th 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Aug 19th 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- \*Held at the First United Methodist Church. They have raised the prices, so some adjustments will need to be made on some things.
- \*"Theme: "In the Garden" You can make a quilt that goes with the theme, but this is not required. Also, if you already have a quilt that meets the theme, you are welcome to enter it. Older quilts would be great.
- \*You can choose to have your quilt judged, but this is not required. Judging will be---amateur and professional.
- \*Categories: \*\*Challenge quilts, Theme Quilt, Pieced quilt, Applique quilts, Art quilt quilts, hand quilted items, bags, and table runners. Details of how they will be judged are on the entry form.
- \*\*Challenge quilt is if you have a challenge quilt from another year, you can finish it and enter for this category.
- \*Enter up to 3 quilts. Challenge quilts are excluded from this limit.

Bags and table runners are judged people's choice only.

- \*Boutique: This year the % will be 50/50 or 100% This is to help offset the increased cost of the venue. The boutique is more successful when more people contribute thing for sale.
- \*The bake sale was successful enough last year that the Boutique chairperson would like to extend it to Friday and Saturday. Keep in mind, we all should help contribute something to be sold.
- \*Entry forms and Boutique forms will be on our web page as soon as they are available.
- \*As always, our opportunity quilt is a big part of our show. Let's see how many tickets we can sell.

### Program: "Quilts by Dael" by Richard Tharpj

An artsy kind of man, Richard was originally from Western Kentucky, outside of Paducah. On his Grandma's family farm, he remembers quilts such as Flower Garden and Double Wedding Ring. As a 5-year-old, he was cutting squares. He started out hand piecing and quilting and was told it was cheating to do it by machine. In 2013, on a ranch, he designed barn quilts for Accuquilt. Some of those were, Fade of Orange, Blue Corn Flowers, and Mardi Gras. The name of the ranch is Winterspring Fiber Ranch. He has a lot of Alpacas, sheep, and lambs of which he spun wool and weaved. He showed us some beautiful colors of purple and blue wool scarves. One tapestry he showed had 1.3 million stitches of varied types made of felt dark blue and gold colored threads. He also showed a felted pillow made with 12 needles with a Baby Lock. What a multitalented person who drew some interest in his use of threads.
