  to start taking down the show at 4 pm. At 4:45 p.m., pick up your display items/quilts.


Refer to the entry form for information about the categories and what you need to do to enter.

The unusual thing is they quilt sitting down on the ground for many hours at a time, and sometimes squatting. I think many of us would not have that ability. They do not have templates, instead, they cut out what they want to use by sight. Dana brought quilts for sale and showed us many wonderful samples of what they make. Thank you, Dana, for showing us what possibilities are for people to quilt and enjoy the art of quilting.
