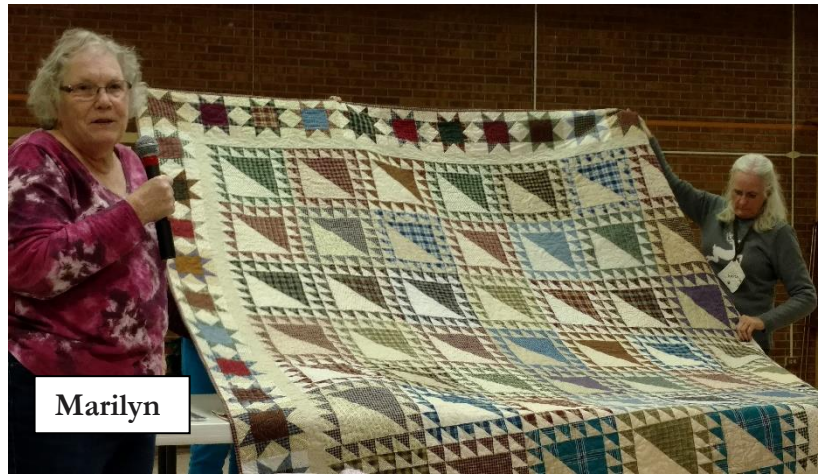

January 7th, 2019 Meeting Notes Neoma White, Secretary

The meeting was called to order by our new President, Cathy James. Items discussed were:

1. Discontinuation of door prizes and membership cards.
2. Roster publication and distributions. This item engendered some discussion, no final decisions were made, and a vote was not taken.

Debbie Pryzmus said the Community Quilts Sew Day at the Library will continue (see the monthly calendar for dates). At the last sew day they got 9 tops prepped for quilting, 4 tops completed and 20 blankets for Laramie County Kids.

Cathy discussed the new Open Sew night at the Guild. Third Monday of the month (unless Program speaker conflicts). The meeting will start at 6 p.m., open with a short demonstration and then individuals can sew on their own projects, hand or machine. If you need a project, kits from Community Quilts will be available along with cutting and binding. **Note: we had 18 ladies show up for our first Sew Night – even with the predicted snow storm!**

Marilyn Lanham welcomed everyone to join the QOV National Sew Day on 2/2/19 and their next scheduled regular meeting on 2/5/19 (see calendar for information).

Mona Weeks has agreed to head up the Round Tuit this year. Information to follow.

Carol Gardner discussed a program to bring in younger sewers or quilters. She solicited input and ideas and will try to put something together for us.

Appraisal for the 2018 Quilt Show Opportunity Quilt was \$8588. Appraisal for Incentive Quilt was approx. \$1600 (requires some additional information).

Carol Gardner introduced our evening program, Kenn from the Sewing Center.

The evening concluded with refreshments and Show and Tell.
