They lived in Clinton, Maine for more than 32 years. In May 2010, they moved to western Kentucky. They have 6 children and 10 grandchildren and 2 cats; one naughty and one nice.

She has always loved reading, history, and horses. She took a vocational course in horseshoeing after earning a bachelor's degree in history. She doesn't shoe horses anymore, but the experience has come in handy in writing several of her books.

Another longtime hobby of hers is genealogy, which has led her down many fascinating paths. Some of her and her husband's quirkier ancestors have inspired fictional characters.

For many years Susan worked for the Central Maine Morning Sentinel as a freelancer. This experience was a great help in developing fictional characters and writing realistic scenes. She also published nonfiction articles in several magazines and had several short stories appear in Woman's world, Grit and Alfred Hitchcock's Mystery Magazine. She has been blessed with quite a few awards for her books.

All will be wired to the tree with the loop. Laraine Hutchison has made a western type tree skirt. We need a topper. It has been suggested that we take a cowboy hat and collage it with quilt blocks. You are welcome to suggest something else. Anything around or under the tree goes with the tree. If we had something under the tree, it would enhance the looks of it. I will need help to decorate the tree. That happens Dec 3 through the 5th. I think {but am not sure} that the public are welcome to visit the venue and look at the trees on Friday Dec. 6 in the evening. The Auction and dinner are Saturday night. The public is invited to attend if you buy a ticket. All members who help make something for the tree, will have their name put in the drawing to two tickets to the dinner/auction.

Magic City provides services for the handicapped adults here in Cheyenne. The Festival of trees is one fund raiser they facilitate each year.
