# **Community Quilts**

CHQ Community Quilts donated 39 quilts and 2 flannel blankets to local non-profit organizations this month.

Salvation Army, as a part of their mission, works to relieve poverty by fighting hunger, giving warmth, and clothing the needy. CHQs gift to them included 12 quilts and 2 flannel blankets.

Family Promise of Cheyenne provides the homeless with emergency and ongoing shelter, meals, and supportive services. They work with local churches in their efforts, and that includes housing those in need in the churches. To meet distancing requirements due to the virus they were temporarily using a B & B for housing but have recently been able to move back into the churches. They indicated that they could use and would be very grateful to receive 30 quilts. We were able to give them 27 quilts. That included full, twin, crib, and 3 lap quilts.

Kudos to everyone making quilts. There is need in our community and I am told that the need will be even greater in the fall as the weather gets cold.










Hand embroidered on border & applique on the 6 large blocks. I followed Annette Ornelas's mystery quilt along. Pattern & my colors. Linda P.
