Three unique apps for Quilters from NNN Software. All were designed and tested with the assistance of an accomplished quilter. Each one is unique — together these unique tools help you confidently plan quilt projects, so you can spend more of your precious quilting time actually working with fabrics, sewing and quilting.

QuiltSandwich app has a yardage calculator that figures the amount of fabric needed for all the layers of a quilt sandwich. It creates cutting diagrams for each piece, making it easy to get the most out of your fabric — yardage and Fat Quarters. QuiltSandwich app takes the pressure off getting all the numbers right by giving quilters a way to easily double check plans and quilt kits *before cutting*:

- Make a quilt of your own design using your favorite methods
- Adapt a pattern to a different size
- Figure yardage for die cutting
- Confirm a kit has the right amount of fabric before cutting
- Easily share quilts and design notes
- Snap a picture of fabrics and compare values to help with construction of blocks and patterns

QuiltSize app helps quilters quickly answer the question, "How many blocks do I need?" Just enter the overall size for your quilt and blocks. Now — play with borders, sashing, setting — and observe the diagram instantly adjust, adding and subtracting blocks to show how many will actually fit within the size you wanted.

QuiltPaper app gives creative quilters design pages that are better than 4 squares per inch! It creates exact templates that can be printed for piecing. It gives quilters tools to create custom grids that mean less drafting when planning quilts! Begin by setting the number of squares needed, then add divisions to "pre-draw" lines for triangles. Let QuiltPaper add borders and sashing to the layout for you. Plan an on-point quilt using Diagonal paper! Purchase additional, unique types, to plan a quilt or to create your own templates for English Paper Piecing: Hexagon, Diamond, Triangle, Tumbler, Eight-point Star, Six-point Star, Honeycomb (Lucy Boston patterns), Log Cabin, Jewel, Kite, Polygon, and Brick.

It's easy to create graph paper —

- 1. Choose a type of paper
- 2. Customize the grid
- 3. Use coloring tools to plan the design and fabrics
- 4. Set paper size & create a PDF to Print or Share

IMPORTANT NOTE: Neither QuiltSandwich, QuiltSize nor QuiltPaper provide block designs. There are marvelous resources available to quilters for block designs — from fancy programs to pencil and paper. If you want to use pencil and paper, check out the app QuiltPaper. QuiltPaper creates unique quilter's graph papers that can be printed or colored on your device.

Developer bio:

Allen Norskog worked as an electrical engineer for over 30 years at Hewlett-Packard and its spin-offs in northern Colorado. Before retiring, Allen worked in a graphics lab on 3D software. Allen also worked on designing a variety of chips for instruments and computer equipment. After getting an iPhone in around 2010, he has been busy with writing various apps to put on the phone or iPad.



Posh Penelope Class by Daenette More

After January 15th you may purchase the Quick Curve Ruler (\$25) and the Posh Penelope pattern (\$12) by Sew Kind of Wonderful at a 10% discount at Around the Block. You will get this class discount if your name is on the Class list that Barb will have. Even though this is a stash friendly pattern, anything will work -- fat quarters included.

Posh Penelope is a fun scrappy quilt that combines gradual curves with on point sashing's and cornerstones. The perfect mix of modern and traditional elements that create a quilt that is timeless. This is a stash pattern and requires the Quick Curve Ruler by Sew Kind of Wonderful. If you are afraid of inset curves, this is an easy, fun class for you. The ruler does the work. The Supply list is what is to be handed out at sign up in January.

Cheyenne Heritage Quilter Guild Meeting January 6, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Deb O'Grady. We had 12 guests join us for our meeting.

Announcements included information for Daenette's class to be held at Little Bear on February 15, 2020. A special ruler is required for the class. The pattern and ruler are available at Around the Block at a 10% discount. This is a "scrap buster" project. The largest piece in the quilt is 6 3/4 inches. You will receive details and instructions once you register and pay for the class.

The program for the evening was a trunk show presented by **Kathy Sconce** with assistance from Cindy Paul. The presentation was done in a question answer format. Kathy started quilting many years ago and she has explored several styles and techniques during that time. She especially likes to collect Asian inspired fabric. Her husband even buys fabric for her when he travels. In addition to quilting, Kathy is also a talented embroiderer. Some of her quilts include embroidery in the design. Her sister did the embroidery on one of the quilts that she showed. Kathy told us that she quilts in the mornings and does embroidery in the afternoons. She also teaches embroidery at Around the Block quilt shop. Following a break and a chance to see Kathy's work up close, we had Show and Tell.
