






# CHQ Quilting Tips



### Quick Quilting tips from the Newsletter Editor:

- Unique Quilting Tools found around the house... but should be boughten new
  - O Pipe cleaners used to clean the inside of your machines and can be bent to fit in tight areas.
  - New Toilet Brush used to clean thread off of your carpet
- ♣ Unique Quilting Tools found in a local auto store for so much less \$\$\$
  - Magnet bowl used to hold pins, screws, small screwdrivers
  - Magnet pen (telescoping magnet pen)
  - O Telescope Mirror used to see in areas of your machine you normally couldn't see (also look for a phone app called Magnifying Glass with Light which is awesome for detecting images that your eyes are unable to see and you are able to snap a photo for a better look.



# Tip from Debbie B.



Normally, the articles should be about quilting, but I want to let you know what happened to me this past month. In my former life (before retirement) I was a forensic accountant, helping non-profits with investigating fraud and embezzlement.

I get up in the morning and check my e-mail and Facebook, before I start my day. On January 22, I wasn't able to log on to Facebook and was asked to sign back in. I saw that my e-mail associated with my Facebook account had been changed...not by me. That sent up an immediate red flag. I went to my Amazon account and removed the billing information and to any other account I had a automatic payment associated with it.

My son posted on my page that my Facebook account had been hacked, but I got notices that others had accepted my friend request (which I hadn't sent) and their accounts were hacked too. There was nothing I could do to stop it, since I didn't know the notices had been sent until too late.

The hacker was able to access out financial information and on-line orders were placed for about \$4000.00. Thankfully, I was able to stop these orders, change account numbers and freeze our credit. I also got a huge number of very explicit pornographic text messages. Both Cheyenne PD and other police jurisdictions were involved, along with the FBI.

What have I learned from this experience?

- Facebook is of no help. They don't respond. It's up to you to police your accounts and be aware
  of any changes to it.
- Scrutinize your financial records and put restrictions on your accounts limit on-line sales to a
  certain amount and they can't be completed without your approval.
- If you don't have any plans for large purchases in the very near future, place a freeze on your credit with the National Credit Bureaus. No one can set up new accounts or make large purchases in your name without your being contacted to release the freeze.
- Your browser keeps all your accounts sign-ins and passwords. Go through everything and change them. Make a list using a USB stick and keep your information on it, not on your computer.
- Stay on top of everything. This can create a nightmare to work through but by staying vigilant, it won't ruin you financially.



# CHQ Quilting Fun



- 4 An attachment to a sewing machine to achieve 1\4 seams.
- 6 Small blocks that join sashing.
- 7 A small tool to take out unwanted stitches. Also known in Jan's newsletter as the RIP IT RIP IT stitch.
- 8 Strips of fabric sewn in between blocks.
- 10 NOT a blanket
- 14 Put this down when Free Motion Quilting.
- 15 One type of a batting's thickness.
- 21 Can create 2 units when sewing corner to corner twice parallel.
- 23 Fabric stitched by machine or hand to finish the outside edges of a quilt.
- 24 Type of quilt when using small orphaned pieces of fabric.
- 25 When colors and dies misbehave. Causes quilters to debate about prewashing fabrics
- 26 Part of a quilt sandwich. Sometimes made of wool.
- Blocks placed at a 45 degree angle to create a quilt top.
- 29 Plastic guide with measurements.

CORNERSTONES

#### Down

- 1 Back side of fabric.
- 2 Stitching with feed dogs down.
- 3 If binding on a curve then cut on the
- 5 This location is in between two pieces of fabric when wanting to quilt but not see the stitches.
- 9 A unit pieced together. Multiple units creates a guilt.
- 11 Round Tuit helps eliminate these.
- 12 A shape or design placed on fabric to trace of cut out.
- 13 A piece of fabric 18" x22"
- 16 A method of ironing for guilters.
- 17 Piecing small cut fabric to create a larger quilt design.
- 18 A technique that saves time when piecing.
- 19 A stitches not normally used for piecing.
- 20 Part of quilt sandwich. Should be 4-6 inches larger if a longarmer is quilting.
- 22 Process where fabric is sewn together.
- 26 Cut on the 45 degree angle often used with curved quilts.
