


## Virtual Show and Tell

# CHQ Quilting Tips



## Quick Quilting tips from the Newsletter Editor:

- **\*** Use Pipe cleaners to clean your sewing machine
- \* If you have a single hole needle plate use it for piecing to prevent your fabric from getting sucked into the feed dogs.
- \* Did you know you can use your walking foot to piece. I use mine all the time.

## Debbie Baldwin has a wonderful tip for quilters who buy large bolts of batting.


"I was looking at videos on You Tube and came across this storage idea for quilt batting.

Last year, I was helping a gentleman dispose of his wife's sewing things. One of my purchases was a new roll of batting in a sealed box. It's rather cumbersome to pull out and put back in.

The video I watched showed dismantling an office chair and using the base for wheeled storage of the roll of batting.

I looked at Facebook Marketplace and found a business that was closing. Rather than chairs, they had footstools. Two for \$10.00. Can't beat that. I bought both, one for my knitting machines and one for the batting holder.

Turn the chair over and remove the clip. That is holding the seat onto the chair. You slide the seat off, wipe it down and the cardboard tube inside the batting fits the chair base perfectly. Cover the roll with plastic to keep the dust off. It will roll easily to wherever you need."


