Cowboys and Angels

Once again, CHQ will be sponsoring a Christmas tree for the Magic City Enterprises' Festival of Trees fundraiser. This corporation provides support to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Your board members served as the initial

committee and agreed upon the theme of "Cowboys and Angels" with a color theme of Wyoming BROWN and GOLD. The tree will be six to seven foot tall, bearing a crocheted angel tree topper donated by Donna D. and Judy G. has volunteered to do some special gold bead work. Coordinator, Carole G. will be circulating a signup sheet at our October 4, 2021 meeting for 6 volunteers to physically decorate the tree on a date yet to be determined. There is a need for 200 handmade ornaments to fill our tree.

In 2019, the CHQ tree drew the largest bid of the evening bringing in \$1,000 for our charity. Let's try to make that happen once again! Your brown and gold cowboy or angel themed ornaments may be brought to the November 1, 2021 meeting or delivered to Carol G. at her residence (address listed in your membership roster) OR to Cynthia H. at her place of business Crazy Motor Sports 2118 E Lincoln Way (open M-W 2:00-6:00 p.m. or Saturdays 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.). The deadline for ornament delivery is Wednesday, November 24, 2021. Please ensure that your ornaments have a hanging loop no greater than 1 inch in length, thus making the drop ½". This request is due to the mandate that all ornaments be wired to the tree for secure mobility when being delivered to the bidding winner.

Free Motion Quilting (FMQ) with Embroidery

Tips and Tricks



Penny recommended using any blue line water soluble marker for marking her quilts. However, if the blue marks don't disappear with water, you can use the Blue Line Marker Be Gone recipe (which she found on the internet) ... 1 cup of water, 1 teaspoon of baking soda mixed in a spray bottle and the marks will disappear like the ghost in your attic.

Batting:

Penny recommend using wool batting and even doubling it to get the dazzling puffy technique and make your embroidery design pop out as your FMQ will retract to the background. Penny recommends not to iron the quilt if you are using wool batting.

Embroidery Designs:

Penny uses the Embroidery Library because not only are they beautiful, but they often go on sale. (Machine Embroidery Designs at Embroidery Library! - Embroidery Library (emblibrary.com). Simple embroidery and background stitching makes beautiful wall quilts.

Thread:

Penny recommends using a 60-weight thread or higher to allow the FMQ to sink in the quilt. She uses the Superior Thread since she finds it readably available at the Sewing Center of Cheyenne.

FMQ and Rulers



Penny recommends using simple straight lines either by using markings from a fabric pen and a ruler or using the Line Tamer ruler. Then you can stitch a few feathers or large/more difficult designs and surround them with simple FMQ or scribbling the background to pop the embroidery design out. Starting in the center and quilting out to the edges will prevent creases or folds. You can also echo around your embroidery design or other FMQ designs you create. No matter what you chose to do Penny encourages quilters to give it a try. Your favorite technique will appear with practice.

Finishing the Wall Quilt with Sleeves:

We learned that Penny did not enjoy hand stitching sleeves on the back of her wall art quilts. So, she got creative and bought the Elmer's Clear Washable glue and glues the sleeve on the back. Now if you wash the wall quilt (which she does not recommend) then the sleeves may fall off, but you can always readd them with a little more glue or use a fabric glue for a more permanent solution. Start adding sleeves and labels to your quilts to be Quilt Show ready.

Penny, thank you for taking time out of your day to inspire the CHQ Members to start FMQ on small projects. Your work is amazing.




CHQ Quilting Tips





Quick Quilting tips from the Newsletter Editor:

Preparing for a Class



Ensure you bring an extension cord (you never know who has one and who doesn't).

Clean your machine before class, put in a new needle, pre-wind two to three bobbins, do your homework (what the instructor requests you to do)

Try not to jump ahead. BUT if you have the pattern or resources, you can then read/watch them before the class. I don't know about you but that helps my anxiety a little but don't assume you know the instructions the teacher will give so don't jump ahead.

Get a good night of sleep, take inventory the day before of your supplies, show up early to set up, and enjoy your class! Don't forget to bring your project in at the next CHO meeting for show and tell!!!



We had 26 members step up to participate in our fun-filled Ugly Fat Quarter




Christmas exchange challenge project. Each fat quarter was placed in a numbered bag along with a notion. We tracked the numbered bags by the donor quilters name. Members participating are required to make a project, be it a table runner, a table topper, a bag/purse, a lap quilt, a wall hanging, a scissor case, a mug rug, or whatever. Keep your project confidential for the final reveal. Finished projects are to be wrapped, the number from the bag added as a gift tag, and brought to the December 6, 2021, meeting where we reveal the last "fun factor" to this challenge.


