






If a technique is giving you some problems, ask for help. **Keep the ¼ inch seam allowance.** Community quilts are often used hard and washed often. Construction counts a lot. **Try to get all the corners to match.** Follow the instructions. You will have beautiful results. Donna Dolan and I are willing to help any time you need it so if you have any questions. Just give us a call.


October Program - Laura Shotwell - Antique Quilts

The October program featured a guest speaker, Laura Shotwell, the owner of Figleaf in Fort Collins.

She brought her collection of Antique Quilts from the 1800's to share with us. Below is a sampling of Laura's extensive collection.

We learned that many of these quilts were made of fabric purchased specifically for each project, rather than using scraps as is commonly thought. Surprised us a bit. She explained the difference between autograph quilts and memory quilts. We saw many variations of lone star quilts. She shared a child's quilt full of animals made with broderie perse technique. We saw a quilt made of scraps of clothing from a time when things were scarce during a war and so much more.

All in all there was a lot of information, but we were still left wanting more.
