JANUARY 5, 2026 PROGRAM - Cleata Zlenka & Debbie Przymus Trunk Show

Our own Cleata Zlenka and Debbie Przymus will be presenting a trunk show of all their beautiful work to CHQ.

Cleata began quilting in 1998 when a good friend pestered her to try quilting. She registered them for a class in Fort Collins. This was the beginning of a long passion for quilting. Early on, she discovered a great love for batik fabric, so she has a large collection of batik fabric in her stash. One of earliest quilts Cleata made was a feathered star. She despised that quilt because many of the star points were truncated. She had not yet learned the fine art of getting points to come out perfect. As Cleata progressed in quilting, she always sought a better ways to piece quilt blocks. She subsequently discovered the Accuquilt die cutting system which turned her into an avid fan. Her quilt patterns and instructions now note conversion instructions using the

Accuquilt die system. "It is a very rare quilt that has not been cut out using Accuquilt", she said. After retiring, Cleata added an embroidery machine to her collection of machines. Thus embroidery appears in some of her quilts.

After a career in Administration and Accounting, Debbie Przymus purchased a Gammil quilting machine and began her second career as a long arm quilter. She has quilted for others for over 10 years. As a quilter she is passionate about the Accuquilt die cut system and has made numerous presentations on its use. Her favorite quilt artists are Edyta Sitar with Laundry Basket Quilts and Kim Diehl. She also enjoys Cross stitch, machine embroidery, paper crafts, and painting.





CHQs 2026 Opportunity Quilt Committee led by Mary Ellen Little as Chairman, along with members Kathy Holt and Marci Rulon, have selected, purchased and cut the official quilt for 2026. Using the fabric line Celebrating 250 Years by Scott Flanagan for Banyan Batiks and using the pattern Grand Ole Flag by Scott Flanagan from the book "Forever Fabulous Fat Quarter Quilts" as a guide, we hope to design and present a quilt to celebrate 250 years of the USA.

Fabric has been cut and will be divided into an "A" block and a "B" block, then placed into baggies for distribution at our January meeting for members to assist with the construction. We ask that members take a precut block or two and construct that block based on instructions placed in their baggie. Please prepare your blocks as soon as possible, as the committee would like to have the quilt top finished by March, 2026.
