

Ready for a trio of presentations covering a "Starry Night" quilt by Van Gogh, or creating string quilts of your own creation, or adding machine embroidery to your quilts? Then you will not want to miss our next program as our presenters guide you on this journey of creative quilting. Deb Koerwitz, Keith Blaney and Cindi Young will be your guides.

Deb began sewing when she was around 8 years of age and did garment construction and mending for her parents' family of eight.



She took her first quilting class in 1983 and never looked back. Deb started piecing by hand because that's the only way she could be precise. A wise quilter encouraged Deb to begin machine piecing which dramatically helped productivity. Since then, she has taken many quilting classes, both online and in person. Always learning! Deb entered the world of longarm quilting in 2017 and is amazed at how much she still has to learn. She loves bright colors and unusual designs, including art and improv quilting. Learning to push boundaries and look forward to the rest of the journey!



As a commercial embroiderer, Keith always thought it would be fun to make a quilt on that wonderful 12 needle Brother, but was always too busy. When he retired, his wife, Susan, bought him a sewing machine. Those first couple of quilts didn't turn out very good and often need repairs, but the hook was set. After a beginner's class, five years, and 57 quilts later, they're turning out better these days. His favorite projects are throws and twins, using traditional block patterns.

Cindi Young has been quilting for more than 30 years and has worked in the quilting industry for over 10 years (retail shops, teaching, and long-arm quilting). She has attempted many different patterns and techniques in her quilting journey, with her favorite being machine applique. She tends to have several projects going on at once. Ten years ago, she bought her first embroidery machine where she began adding embroidery work to her quilts. She looks forward to sharing simple techniques to incorporate machine embroidery into our quilts.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - Cathy Wissner

Dear Talented Quilters, as we go into 2026, the CHQ Board is looking to bring a couple of very important issues to the General Membership.

The first being, CHQ becoming a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization and updated CHQ By-laws. However, I want to address a concern voiced at the January GM meeting about the requirements for CHQ filing a tax report at the end of the year. Per the IRS on 501(c)(3) "for small organization with gross receipts at \$50,000 or less you would file Form 990-N (e-Postcard)". Which is easy to fill out and e-mail back to the IRS.

Becoming a 501(c)(3) nonprofit has advantages for CHQ. Many foundations and corporations will only donate to 501(c)(3)s. We can legally call and hold raffles & silent auctions.

There are potential discounted or free services, like: Google for Nonprofits, YouTube ads credits, Microsoft-nonprofit pricing,

reduced advertising costs on other media. CHQ can qualify for: state sales tax exemption and reduced venue fees. Donations and grants do not create federal income tax issues and program revenue may also be tax-exempt (if related to our mission).

It also enhances credibility and public trust. IRS recognition signals: accountability, transparent governance and adherence to federal regulations, donors, partners, and sponsors tend to trust organizations that meet federal nonprofit standards.

Under a 501(c)(3), CHQ has Limited Liability Protection, a nonprofit shields directors, officers, and founders from personal liability tied to the organization (except for misconduct).





Debbie had many tips for members. She showed some small quilts with creative framing ideas. (see photos) And her "Worth the price of the ticket" wrinkle release/starch trick.




